ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Poverty Alleviation Fund (PPAF) has provided large-scale disaster relief, supporting 260,000 households during droughts, building 120,000 earthquake-resistant homes, assisting 859,000 flood-affected families, and aiding 66,000 households during COVID-19.

According to Economic Survey 2024-25 released on Monday, despite contributing less than 1 percent to global emissions, Pakistan remains highly climate vulnerable. PPAF addresses this through climate adaptation, green jobs, renewable energy, and community resilience aligned with national and global frameworks.

Key achievements include conserving 2.23 million m³ of water, generating 14 MW of renewable energy, planting 130,000 trees, and engaging youth in environmental awareness.

In the 2022-2023 floods, it delivered emergency aid to over 87,600 households, ensuring high beneficiary satisfaction and better access to essential services.

Transforming Lives: PPAF's scaled-up anti-poverty initiatives

In its continued efforts to fight multidimensional poverty, the Pakistan Poverty Alleviation Fund (PPAF) has made significant strides across social protection, economic empowerment, renewable energy, health, education, and gender inclusion, as highlighted in the Pakistan Economic Survey 2024-25.

From July 2024 to March 2025, PPAF established 1,450 new Community Institutions, trained 23,500 community members (50% women), and reached a cumulative total of 171,000 community organizations nationwide with over 2.67 million members with 63 percent women.

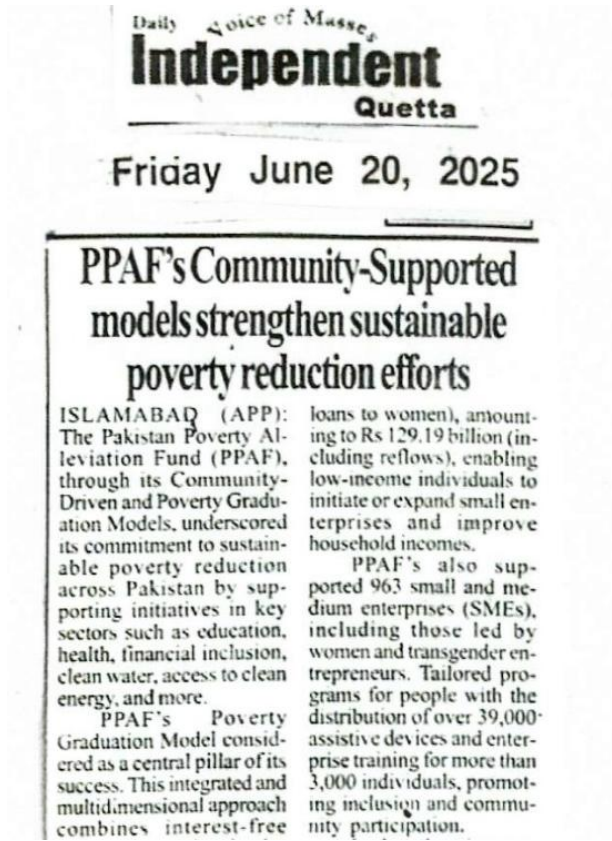

اسلام آباد (امت نیوز) پاکستان اکناک سروے نے قومی سطح پر غربت کے خاتمے میں پاکستان پاورٹی ایلیمینیشن فنڈ (PPAF) کے کلیدی کردار کو سراہا ہے۔ سروے میں پی پی اے ایف کے پاورٹی گریجویشن ماڈل کو اس کی کامیابی کا مرکزی عنصر قرار دیا گیا ہے۔ یہ مربوط اور کثیرالجہتی ماڈل بلاسوقرضوں کو ملتی ترقیت، پیداواری اثاثوں کی فراہمی، کاروباری مشاورت اور مالیاتی خواندگی کے ساتھ جوڑتا ہے۔ یہ ماڈل بین الاقوامی بہترین طریقہ کار سے متاثر ہو کر تشکیل دیا گیا ہے۔ پی پی اے ایف اور بینظیر انکم سپورٹ پروگرام (BISP) کے مشترکہ مستفیدین کے تجزیے سے ظاہر ہوتا ہے کہ 3 لاکھ 34 ہزار 596 گھرانوں میں سے ایک لاکھ 43 ہزار 43 گھرانے یعنی 32 فیصد اب اس قابل ہو چکے ہیں کہ وہ بی آئی ایس پی کے سماجی تحفظ کے دائرے سے باہر آ سکیں۔ پی پی اے ایف نے ملک بھر میں ایک لاکھ 71 ہزار سے زائد کیسز کو اپنی ادارے قائم کیے ہیں جن میں سے 63 فیصد ارکان خواتین ہیں۔ مالی شمولیت کے میدان میں، فنڈ نے اب تک 35 لاکھ سے زائد بلاسوقرضے فراہم کیے، جن میں 56 فیصد خواتین کو دیے گئے، اور ان کی مجموعی مالیت 129.19 ارب روپے (ری فلو سمیت) ہے۔ ان قرضوں کی بدولت کم آمدنی والے افراد نے چھوٹے کاروبار شروع یا وسعت دی اور اپنے گھریلو آمدنی میں بہتری لائی۔ اس کے علاوہ، فنڈ نے 963 چھوٹے درمیانے درجے کے کاروبار (کی ٹی) ماحولیاتی تبدیلی اور بہتر ترقی کے حوالے سے اکناک سروے میں پی پی اے ایف کی جانب سے 450.1 گرین انرجی منصوبوں کے تحت 14 میگا واٹ سے زائد قابل تجدید توانائی کی فراہمی کو سراہا گیا ہے، جس سے 5 لاکھ 86 ہزار افراد مستفید ہوئے۔ اس کے علاوہ، فنڈ نے 22 لاکھ 30 ہزار معیاری کھوکھلیاں اور ایک لاکھ 30 ہزار درخت لگائے،
